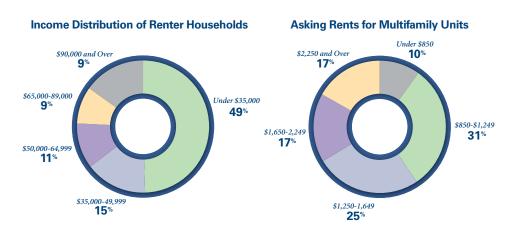


OUR MISSION:

South Shore Habitat for Humanity is a faith-based, nonprofit organization dedicated to delivering simple, decent, affordable homes in partnership with families in need.

Dear Friends of South Shore Habitat,

The percentage of people without access to decent, stable housing is rising. While this is a national concern, it is a local concern. Massachusetts ranks 44th in homeownership rates, 48th in affordability and 49th in racial diversity, according to the Warren Group, a Boston real estate tracking firm. Joint Center for Housing Studies illustrates that only about 10 percent of our recently added rental apartments would be affordable to the nearly half of renter households in America who make less than \$35,000 a year. **Renters now pay almost 49% of their income on housing.**



What does this mean? Increasing the affordable housing supply across the globe is essential. Ensuring that all families have a safe and stable place to call home should be a public policy priority. While daunting, it is an achievable goal. Habitat for Humanity provides a solution. **Our homeowners spend less than 30% of their annual income on their mortgages.** Additionally, South Shore Habitat homes have deed riders, protecting their affordability in perpetuity. Rental rates can continue to rise, prohibiting even higher income individuals to have access to units. Empty housing isn't the solution, affordable housing is. By supporting SSHH, you are helping to increase the production of affordable housing and helping more individuals and families.

Our work is not done. Chad and I are excited to kick-off our 30th anniversary of service to the South Shore community. We invite you to consider increasing your involvement with our affiliate in whatever way best fits your philanthropic agenda. Perhaps it is financially, increased volunteer engagement on a build site or at the ReStore, or you can assist us with our biggest challenge – land acquisition. We need your help to identify land or properties on which to build or rehab in our 35 cities in towns. If you know of a place we can build, or want to assist in this area, please let us know.

We have witnessed volunteers and donors give their time, talent and resources so that our Family Partners could forge a path to success and homeownership. One of our homeowners recently shared her gratitude by saying, "A simple word of thanks, can't possibly express how we truly feel! We haven't been provided with just a home – it's our future, our faith and our self-respect!"

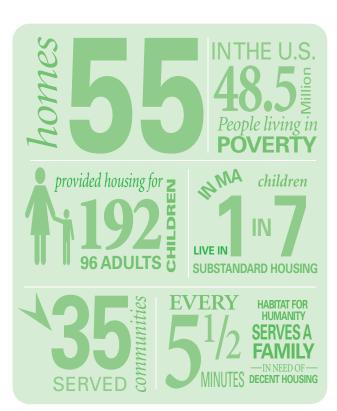

SSHH was one of 300 affiliates selected to participate in the 2015 National Women Build Week. More than 23,000 volunteers nationally took part in the eighth annual event.

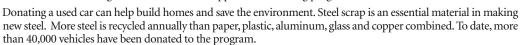

209 homes for the Salvadoran community. Volunteers participated in SSHH's 2nd Global Village trip in November 2015. Our next trip is planned for Fall 2016 in celebration of our 30th Anniversary.

We will be expanding our network and deepening our partner engagement within our service area. To accomplish this we will:

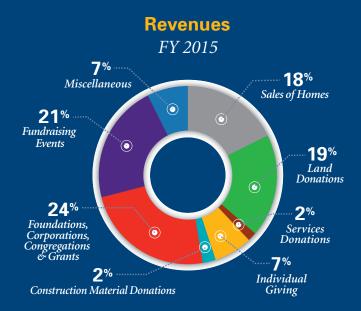
- Increase the number of volunteers, donors and advocates who support us in a variety of ways

- Provide individuals with new volunteer opportunities through the ReStore

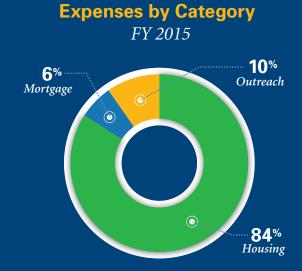
Sustainability

- Family Partners, the Ford and Ferland families successfully paid off their mortgages



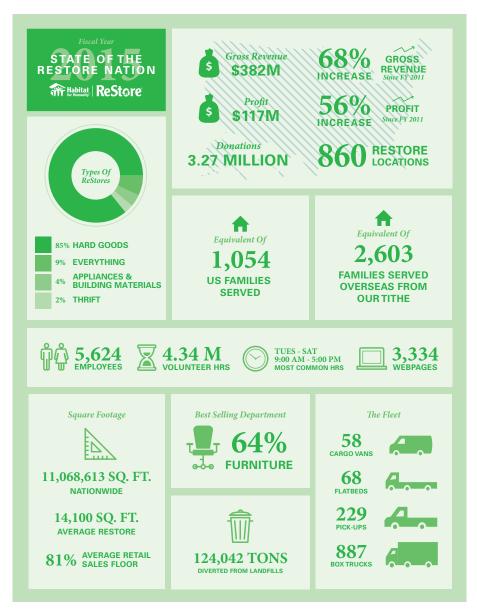


Coming Soon: Late Spring 2016!
